Faydra and I can never say thank you enough to each and every one of you who is part of our ministry at MFI. Without your support, we wouldn't be able to meet the great needs of those we serve.

We have been so busy this year with me flying more in 2021 than any other year since I joined MFI. I'm one of only three captains and despite all Haiti has been through, the need for our services continues to grow.

Everyone has their sphere of knowledge when it comes to news. So, I'll give a quick recap of Haiti and 2021.

In July, the Haitian president was assassinated – causing considerable uncertainty and unrest. Not much has changed in the months since. Gangs are increasing in size and boldness. Kidnappings are rampant – culminating in the taking of 17 missionaries and their families on October 16. MFI has a relationship with that mission and missionaries, making that situation quite personal.

In August, a major earthquake hit the southwest peninsula of Haiti. Partnering with many organizations, we flew more than 20 extra flights moving well over 100,000 lbs of relief supplies and people out to the hardest hit areas.

And most recently, the gangs are attempting to shut down the country by limiting and in some places, eliminating, the availability of fuel. Without fuel, not much can happen. Food doesn't get transported. People can't travel for work. Generators don't run without fuel. Much of Haiti relies on generators for communication and electricity. It's hard to fathom the impact.

I am thankful for my fellow pilots, mechanics, and support staff. When adversity hits, I know we will all pull together to serve to the best of our abilities - using the gifts God has given us for the purpose he has called us. Thank you again for being such a vital part of our team.

Faydra's dad had a stroke, but recovered well and continues to be okay.
